

Charles Bonnet Syndrome Conference



Date: Thursday 25th April Time: 9.30am—4pm Venue: York College

Sight Support HEY is delighted to be coordinating an Information Day about Charles Bonnet Syndrome (CBS).

The condition causes people to see images which are not real. These 'visual hallucinations' are caused by loss of sight, although not everyone with low vision develops the condition. For those who do, CBS can be frightening and debilitating, not least because it may be confused mistakenly with the onset of dementia. For this reason too many people suffer in silence.

The day will be an informative look into the nature of the condition, current research,

including the potential causes of Charles Bonnet Syndrome and it's over activity in the brain as well as what the future might hold. It will include talks from specialists and will show some of the current work to support, manage and treat those with the condition as well as hearing from those who have the condition themselves. Aids and Equipment

Our Resource Centre offers you the opportunity to view aids and equipment that are available to help people with visual impairments. Our Resources Coordinator, Lily Savage, can suggest equipment that may help with your specific eye condition or your personal needs as well as demonstrate equipment and help you to order items. Where possible, please call 01482 342297 to book an appointment to ensure you have a designated time slot in order to have the assistance you require and deserve.

Here are a few items currently available for demonstration:

Talking MedCenter Clock

Need a reminder to take your medication? Then this product may be of help. It is a rectangular clock with



four optional, daily alarms to help remind you when it is time to take your medication.

It announces the time and date and two volume levels, loud and extra loud making it suitable for individuals with hearing loss.

It has large, colour coded operating buttons and a large 40mm digital display.

Talking Watch

This gold coloured talking watch has a large crown, easy-to-see black numbers, wide hands and a genuine leather, white strap.



This watch announces the time and date and has a large crown, easy-to-see black numbers, wide hands and a genuine crocodile effect leather, white strap.

Children's Tactile Watch

This children's watch has a stainless steel case, silver tone dial and is completed with a fun ocean theme strap.



It has a tactile mark indicating 12 o'clock, two dots to indicate 3, 6 and 9 o'clock and one dot to indicate each hour in-between; completed with the lid opening at the 6 o'clock position.
